Combining Payments for Environmental Services

ments for Environmental Services (PES) are increasingly used in environmental and development policies, especially in the South. They mainly concern the management of water and forests, both locally and nationally. Europe is still not making great use of PES, with the exception of Agri-Environmental Measures (AEM) of the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP), established in the 1990s. Nevertheless, their role is likely to

address during these three days. We will come back, among other subjects, to the nature of this instrument and how it is implemented, to the various economic models now in place, to the relation between Pes and Redd+ (Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation), to their interaction with other legal instruments, to the compromises we are seeking between environmental effectiveness, efficiency and poverty alleviation, and to the institutional conditions neces-
